FORTIFIED VILLAGE SITE.

(NOTED JULY
18- 1923.

LOCATION: North side of Logie Creek, about three miles from mouth; on a sagebrush flat which extends South to a dry canyon, flanking a ridge perhaps half mile distance to summit, and extends about one forth-mile west to foot of another ridge breaking away to the west. This flat slopes up from the creek proper, on the east a short distance, rising gradually to to a height of perhaps forty feet above the creek on the north, ~~and~~ which, at the point of the fortification, is an abrupt basaltic cliff of about 28 or thirty feet. The creek-bluff is easily assailed at any other point from the north.

DESCRIPTION

The entrenched site can be described as a square on east and west sides, connected with a half-circle on the south, jutting ~~to the brink of the cliff on the north.~~ to the brink of the cliff on the north. The entire exposed area is protected by a trench, the excavated dirt forming the outer wall. This ridge is perhaps eighteen or twenty inches in height, the trench ~~marked by a~~ several inches in depth and easily traced.

WEDTH OF ENCLOSURE EAST AND WEST, Thirty Eight Steps, rim to rim of the outer trench walls

FROM MOST SOUTHERN POINT OF OUTER RIDGE TO BRINK OF CLIFF ON THE NORTH, Thirty Two Steps

Along the western trench, are ~~four~~ ^{irregular circle} depressions measuring a few feet in diameter, suggestive of inner defensive measures. There are three of such pits along the southern crescent-shaped trench

Extending north and south, are three well defined excavations forming elongated squares. The one on the east, is 15 paces in length by six in wedth. Its eastern wall parelling the outer trench, is four paces from the outer wall of the trench.

The center excavation is 15 paces long by six ()

(3) Excavation occupying western space, is sixteen paces long by five(5) in weath, appex of enclosing ridges.

ALL of these three excavations are more pronounced at their ~~the/at~~ southern extremity, disappearing, or coming to the level of the ground surface at their northern terminal, approximately fifteen or more feet from brink of cliff; the central one 20 feet.

MEASUREMENTS IN FEET.

MEASUREMENTS ARE FROM APPEX OF THE EMBANKMENT RIDGES.

East to west, outer ridges, center of enclosure, ---123 ft.

South to ~~the/at~~ north, 75 feet. This measurement covers only the traces of earthworks, and does NOT include an additional space of 20 feet, intervening to brink of bluff on north.

ADDITIONAL MEASUREMENTS

WEST TO EAST.---Appex of outer western wall to appex of west-wall of No.3 entrenchment, 12 feet. ~~To east wall of No 3-18ft.~~ Width of this entrenchment, 18ft.
